

President's Goal: Helping Dentists Succeed Dr. Shetty Pledges to Make QCDS More Relevant

Dr. Sudhakar Shetty, the new president of the Queens County Dental Society, says he is passionate about "bringing dentists into the fold." It is



one of the primary goals he plans to implement following his installation as QCDS president for the coming year, held at the Chateau Briand in Carle Place in January.

"One way in which we can achieve this," the 34-year member of the Dental Society said, "is to actively consider ways in which QCDS can become more relevant to the practicing dentist in today's Queens. I would like to be open to feedback from dentists about the type of programming and support that they would find most beneficial. I also wish to create a culture at QCDS that is welcoming to members as well as to the leadership.

"I want to hold strong to our goal of helping members dentists succeed, and also to help protect the general public through public health outreach and education. I would like to recruit, retain, and maintain more members, especially new dental graduates. We will seek to increase active involvement in our association of early career dentists."

Dr. Shetty completed his dental education at the University of Bombay, India, with a Bachelors of Dental Surgery degree in 1975. After completing his clinical training, the young dentist worked as a registrar in the Department of Oral Diagnosis and Radiology. He then immigrated to the United States, where he was able to continue his training at New York University, where he earned a D.D.S. degree. He established his first private practice in Woodhaven, where he has remained for 34 years.

"My patients come from varied ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds, truly representative of Queens County," he said. "I work with patients of all ages, from pediatric to geriatric, and welcome the challenge of selective cosmetic cases."

The busy dentist has been dedicated to remaining current with clinical knowledge. As a strong believer in continuing education, he has amassed more than 1,000 hours of CE credits. He decided to pursue further training in oral implantology by completing the maxicourse at Brookdale/NYU in 2005. Dr. Shetty is a fellow of the International Congress of Oral Implantology and has continued to participate in many courses in orthodontics, cosmetic and prosthedontic dentistry. He said he was "humbled" to be selected as a fellow of the Pierre Fauchard Academy, an honorary organization recognizing outstanding dentists and celebrating their achievements.

As soon as he entered the dental profession in 1980, Dr. Shetty became a member of QCDS. In 2005 he became a member of the Board of Trustees and has served on various committees, including Nominating, Membership, Ethics, and Peer Review. He served as president of the Institute of Continuing Dental Education in 2010. "I have had the satisfaction of serving and representing QCDS as chair of the Chemical Dependency Program at NYSDA," he said. He has also represented QCDS as an alternate delegate at NYSDA House of Delegates meetings.

DENTAL MALPRACTICE INSURANCE UPDATE

Topic: Negligent Treatment Plan Claims

Recent Court Decisions

The execution of a properly prepared written informed consent is widely understood to be necessary in the context of surgical procedures, but is often overlooked when treatment plans are being formulated. A review of case law and jury verdicts, however, makes clear that practitioners cannot rely on a simple written treatment plan to establish informed consent, and that it is necessary to secure proper informed consent before initiating any planned restoration.

In *Harvin v. Roth, et. al.*, a patient was provided two options for treatment of loose front teeth and receding gums. The patient signed the written treatment plan, agreeing to the treatment option recommended by the dentist. Following placement of gold/porcelain inlays, the patient required root canal and sued the dentist alleging lack of informed consent for "unnecessary restorative treatment" and a failure to advise of the risks and complications inherent in the treatment. Assessing the dentist's proof of informed consent, the court determined that there were issues of fact for the jury to decide.

Case law also demonstrates that pointing to a patient's signature on a consent form which lists the risks and benefits of the procedure is not, by itself, enough to defeat claims for lack of informed consent where the consent form does not address alternative treatment options, and the patient testifies that alternative treatments were never discussed. *See, e.g., Giambrone v. Farha, et. al.; Rojo v. Young, et. al.*

The American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry predicts increases in the demand for veneer procedures and crown and bridge work. To protect against a corresponding increase in lack of informed consent claims, practitioners should take care to manage patient expectations for treatment outcomes and thoroughly communicate and document discussions regarding the necessity of treatment, the risks, benefits and cost of all treatment options, as well as the prognosis of proposed treatment and any refusal of preferred treatment.

Practice Points

Focus: Obtain proper written informed consent for all restorative treatment plans

Provide patients with a WRITTEN TREATMENT PLAN identifying the necessity of proposed restorations, all known and foreseeable risks and benefits of the recommended treatment, and all treatment alternatives that are generally accepted among dentists in your community, inclusive of referrals to specialists.

Obtain the PATIENT'S SIGNATURE to demonstrate their selected treatment option.

IF RECOMMENDED TREATMENT IS REFUSED, determine whether it is appropriate to dismiss the patient. If it is acceptable to proceed, have the patient sign a statement that they are electing non-preferred treatment and document the reason (ex. inability to pay cost of preferred treatment).

DOCUMENT YOUR CONVERSATION IN THE PATIENT'S CHART and reiterate the necessity of treatment, the risks and benefits of the options, and – where preferred treatment options have been refused – the short term goals and likely prognosis.

Secure a properly executed INFORMED CONSENT FORM that is tailored to the elected procedure.

Strength in numbers is key to making sure that our voices are being heard.

> I beseech you to keep your membership and to explain to your non-tripartite colleagues why it is so important for them to join with us.

> If you are having temporary financial issues, do not let this be a reason to drop your membership. Please do not hesitate to reach out to

me to discuss options that will allow you to keep your membership in the tri-partite.

Jamaica Learning Center Oral Health Screening

Dr. Stuart Kesner and a team from the Jamaica hospital dental department went to the Jamaica Learning Center, an alternative high school, for a day of oral health education. Dr. Kesner was accompanied by dental residents Dr. Karanjit Kamboy, Dr. Jessica Kenemuth and Dr. Pavel Zeylikman as well as Renee Julian and her high school dental assisting students. Screening was done for 120 students for oral cancer and the general condition of their oral health was surveyed. About half of the students had never seen a dentist before! The residents were surprised at how many students had missing molars. One student even thought it was normal for his mouth to swell once a month. In reality, he had multiple curious infected teeth. After each student was screened by one of the residents they were given a toothbrush toothpaste and floss and educated on proper home care by one of their high school dental assisting peers. "Overall the day was a phenomenal success," Dr. Kesner said. He told those participating: "The work you all do impacts not only our students, but also their families. Our students will go home and tell family members about the screening and information they received today. Students who have children will bring their children to the dentist. Your community service sets a great example for the Residents, the Interns, and all receiving the services."

Social Philosophy and Your IRA Planning

We have been encountering estate planning situations where a dental practice owner has more than sufficient net worth to adequately support a surviving spouse and also has children who are self supporting. That dental practice owner should consider allocating a portion of his or her IRA to either grandchildren or a charitable foundation.

IRA For Grandchildren

The use of an IRA to benefit grandchildren is an interesting technique.

There is some concern among grandparents that grandchildren in today's economic and social environment will not have the same educational and vocational options and opportunities as were available to their

grandchildren is an interesting technique. grandparents and parents.

There is no question that competition to get into college is more intense. There is frequently no assurance or even an interest on the part of grandchildren to become professionals, corporate executives or entrepreneurs. The grandchildren may choose career paths with meaningful social purposes, but without significant financial rewards.

Grandparents may want to consider leaving a portion



of an IRA to a grandchild to supplement the grandchild's income.

If, as a hypothetical, a \$500,000 portion of an IRA is left to a 10 year old grandchild (or to a trust on behalf of the grandchild), and if that IRA can earn 5 percent during the grandchild's lifetime, that \$500,000 IRA will disburse \$5,100,000 to the grandchild during the grandchild's life expectancy (age 10 to age 82).

IRA Payable to Charity

If the dental practice owner has significant charitable interests, it makes sense to have a portion of the IRA payable to a family foundation. The family foundation can receive the IRA and pay no income tax because it qualifies as a charity and charities do not pay income tax on receipt of an IRA distribution.

The family foundation is required by law to disburse 5 percent of its net worth annually to public charities.

A number of dental practice owners have adult children who live in different parts of the country. One anxiety, which some parents have, is that the children will lose touch with each other after both parents are deceased. The private foundation offers a unique opportunity to perpetuate the family's charitable interests and to require children to communicate at least on an annual basis as to how to disburse the funds from the private foundation.

The use of an IRA for charities and grandchildren is a technique that parents and grandchildren should consider in addition to the traditional techniques which we use in estate planning, such as Irrevocable Life Insurance Trusts, Credit Shelter Trusts, QTIPs, QPRTs, Sales to Defective Grantor Trusts, GRATs and all the other techniques that form part of the estate planning basket of tools.
