

# NYSDA House of Delegates Holds Its Annual Meeting, Dr. Joel Friedman Becomes President

Dr. Joel Friedman became president of the New York State Dental Association at the meeting of the House of Delegates, held recently at New York City's Grand Hyatt Hotel. The annual meeting marked the conclusion of the term of Dr. P. Deborah Weisfuse.

Reports and resolutions were discussed and refined at Reference Committees, which heard testimony for and against proposed actions. The Chair of the Reference Committees presented recommendations to the delegates at the Saturday session. QCDS members Drs. Bijan Anvar and Jay Ledner were selected as Reference Committee members. Each of the 13 components met in caucus meetings to discuss items before the House, so that each delegate had an understanding of the issues and its consequences. NYSDA Trustee Dr. Joseph Caruso chaired the caucus meeting attended by QCDS delegates as well as by Drs. Doron Kalman, Beatriz Vallejo and Sudhakar Shetty. In addition, all candidates for the elective positions of speaker of the house and ADA Trustee-Elect made presentations at each of the caucus meetings.

The second session of the House was called to order by Speaker Dr. Robert Peskin. Resolutions were presented,

amended, discussed and ultimately voted upon by the 101 delegates, resulting in dispositions of the resolutions. At 5 p.m. Dr. Bijan Anvar hosted an ADA Institute for Diversity in Leadership alumni meeting. It was very well attended and so successful that it will

likely become a model for other states. ADA and NYSDA leadership were also present at the meeting. An evening dinner dance in honor of outgoing President Dr. Weisfuse concluded a full day of activity.

Another session began bright and early, with delegates voting for those challenged elective positions at 7 a.m. leaving little rest for the weary. Dr. Robert Peskin was re-elected as speaker of the house over challenger Dr. Craig Ratner. The election for ADA trusteeelect had three well-qualified candidates, Dr. Michael Breault, Dr. Kevin Henner and Dr. Chad Gehani seeking the position. No candidate received a majority vote on the first ballot. The candidate with the least number of votes was dropped from the necessary second ballot, leaving Drs. Gehani and Henner as candidates to be considered. The sec-



## Dr. Paul S. Kaufman Passes at 80

On July 16, 2013, Dr. Paul S. Kaufman, past president of NYSDA, passed away at the age of 80. Dr. Kaufman attended Hamilton College and the University of Pennsylvania College of Dental Medicine. He obtained his oral surgery training at Kings County and Harlem hospitals. He was a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and practiced for 40 years, first in Queens Village and then in New Hyde Park.

His professional accomplishments are numerous including the presidencies of both the New York State Dental Association and the Queens County Dental Society. He served as a delegate to the ADA for QCDS for many years. Dr. Kaufman was chairman of the Department of Dentistry at Jamaica Hospital Medical Center, where he was instrumental in the growth of the Department of Dental Medicine and the development of the general practice residency at that institution. He served as a voluntary attending at both North Shore University Hospital and Long Island Jewish Medical Center.

An innovator in the field of implant dentistry, Dr. Kaufman lectured extensively both nationally and internationally. He was a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, the International College of Dentists, American Association of Hospital Dentists and a member of the Pierre Fauchard Academy.

Dr. Kaufman was a family man who cherished the time he spent with his loving wife, Roberta Nancy Kaufman; his daughter, Stacy (also a dentist) and her husband, Steven Hoffman; his son, Mark, and daughter—in-law, Stacey; and the grand-children he adored, Scott, Rochelle, Ethan, Spencer and Victoria.

Outside of dentistry, he loved arts and crafts, spending many hours designing and firing clay beads to make jewelry and antiquing. He also enjoyed the theater. In his younger years he enjoyed skiing, tennis and golf. He was a past member of Glen Head Country Club.

He will be dearly missed by his professional colleagues and his beloved family. Dentistry has lost a great leader and one of its strongest advocates.

## **Embracing Our Common Humanity**

Last month I attended a speech given by Former President Clinton at Temple Sinai of Roslyn. The speech was entitled "Embracing our Common Humanity" and discussed, among other things, the many gains we've made in science and technology.

What struck me most during the speech was that we are now able to identify and map genes that cause breast cancer, Alzheimer's, and Parkinson's, among others. Through the genome project, we've learned that everybody in this world

is genomically 99.5 percent the same. "If you look around here tonight, every non age related difference you can see with your neighbors is lodged in one half of one percent of your genome: your hair color, height, body shape, eye color, and so on," the former president said. In other words, the differences we can see are vastly fewer than the similarities that we cannot. President Clinton believes that the salvation of humanity in the 20th century depends upon our success in convincing ourselves and people around the world to pay more attention to the 99.5 percent of us that is just like anybody else.

In my opinion, if we accept one another and respect the differences between us, we can achieve far more than we could otherwise. President Clinton went on to discuss a book he recently read, "The Social Conquest of Earth" by E.O. Wilson. In his book, Wilson argues that life on earth has been dominated by societies who have learned to work to-

gether. Those societies who have learned to cooperate have become those, which feature both the greatest success and the greatest longevity. These great societies include ants, termites, bees, and, of course, people.

In listening to President Clinton speak, I realized that his message is highly applicable to our profession and, more

specifically, to the Queens County Dental Society. I was reminded of the NYSDA House of Delegates meeting I recently attended in which, after much debate, a resolution was passed whereby the current NYSDA president is to appoint a task force that would review the size of the NYSDA House of Delegates. I would vote against a proposition to reduce the size of the House of Delegates from its current 101 members. While many feel that a large group is not necessary, I believe that collaboration between many people of various cultural

backgrounds will produce the best results. Just like those great societies of cooperators, the members of our profession could accomplish far more by working together and remaining inclusive of the many ideas among us.

Furthermore, we in the Queens County Dental Society exemplify this ideal of accepting differences and working together in a number of our programs. Specifically, this October we will be hosting our first ever New Dentist and Diversity Meeting. This two-day meeting will include presentations from both dentists and non-dentists on how to succeed. We will learn innovative methods while also incorporating other disciplines into our practices through lectures from professionals in clinical, law and the insurance sectors. Some of the topics to be covered include predictable implant placement by the general practitioner, practice management tips, preparation for the new I-Stop legisla-

ture, and how to achieve a successful dental hygiene practice. However, this event cannot happen without all of you. I know that the event will have the greatest success and impact if all attend. So, in the words of Bill Clinton, let's all strive to embrace our common humanity by respecting the many differences between us and working together.

# QCDS Sends Volunteers and Colgate Dental Van To Jackson Developmental Center for Screening

In keeping with the QCDS goal of providing services to the community, QCDS Executive Director William Bayer, accompanied by volunteer member dentists, conducted an oral health-screening program for 160 children recently at the Jackson Developmental Center, 31-36 88th Street in Jackson Heights.

Drs. Denis Piana, Risa Samuels, Shazia Akhtar, Ora Canter and Flushing Hospital Medical Center resident David Maricondo made time in their busy schedules to bring the dental screening program to the students at the Center. For many of the four and five year olds who received the dental screening, this was their first exposure to a dentist.

While the screenings are not a substitute for a full dental exam, the screening did identify several students in need on further care. QCDS volunteers reassured those who were apprehensive that the screening process was painless and with one or two minor exceptions, all children were screened. School staff, led by school social worker Janette Tirado, arranged the class schedules with military precision so that "down time" was kept to a minimum.

QCDS has been conducting this community service in

partnership with Colgate for several years. The Dental Society provides volunteer dentists and Colgate provides a converted and customized recreational vehicle, fully equipped with two examination chairs. Colgate provides each student with a "goody bag" and students seem to treat the exams on the Colgate van as a fun experience. QCDS would like to continue offering this service to the community, but continued participation is predicated on the ability of members to volunteer some time to conduct the screenings. The next program is scheduled for October 23 at P.S. 160.

The Center's principal, Irene Fernandez-Gomez, thanked QCDS for bringing this program to her students and said she hopes QCDS will schedule a similar program for a new group of students in the future. She said her goal for this program was to help promote child care for all her students, encourage good health practices, and to help children feel more comfortable going for their dental visits. She called the program an overwhelming success. QCDS thanks Colgate and Carla Johnson of Colgate for providing the van, the supplies and goody bags and looks forward to the partnership continuation with Colgate in their "Bright Smiles, Bright Futures" campaign.

#### Dear Colleague:

We need your help. In Albany, the state's Capital, we are fighting to protect your practice, your patients and your future, as we have always done. But, while dentistry has many friends among the policy makers in Albany, we also have foes, and they are formidable – insurance companies, trial lawyers, hostile government bureaucracies, just to name a few. These entities pose threats as real as they are dangerous, and we, as concerned doctors, must be both vigilant and aggressive in defending our professional prerogatives.

This year we defeated a proposal to reduce reimbursement to dentists providing services under Medicaid. Even if you don't participate in the program, this victory is important. In other states, when dentists can't afford to treat the poor, mid-level providers have been brought in to the detriment of practicing dentists and patients alike. If you do participate in Medicaid, then our efforts relate directly to your ability to make a living. In addition, and perhaps of more significance, the inclusion of adult dental services in Medicaid was made statutory, making it an "Essential Health Benefit" thereby assuring the inclusion of adult dental services in Medicaid when Medicaid is moved into New York's Health Benefit Exchange.

But with every "victory", there arise more challenges. Already this legislative session, there have been eleven bills introduced which have some bearing on professional liability. Some we support, most we oppose – but those are supported by a strong Trial Lawyer's lobby. In addition, bills relating to expanded hygiene, mid-level provider and denturology are on the table. We are also supporting legislation to allow qualified dentists the opportunity to provide a broader array of facial cosmetic procedures for their patients who desire them – legislation opposed by our medical colleagues. So you can see, our profession cannot stand still and you cannot afford to be apathetic.

Effective political action takes effort and it takes money. The New York State Dental Association will make the effort, but it relies on EDPAC for the resources necessary to give it a powerful voice. 



## Help Heirs With Proper Digital Asset Management

For better or worse, a large percentage of our life resides online. We have become a paperless society with contact information, photographs, family trees and banking information all available via computer or smartphone. Rarely are there hard copies of documents readily available to you and your family in an emergency. With our lives residing in the "cloud," not only do we feel inconvenienced and irascible when the wifi connection at Starbucks is weak, but imagine how you would react if a family member died and you couldn't access the online banking information to pay the mortgage or the email account that has the whole family's contact information?

Very few states have laws on the books as to how to handle these situations, so there are some steps to take to ensure access to your digital estate:


- Keep a hard copy list of user names and passwords of online bank accounts, investment accounts, e-mail providers, credit cards, social media accounts, blogs and music sites.
- Store this information in a secure place. This is the hard part. If you have ever had an identity theft issue, you understand what can happen if this information can fall into the wrong hands. A safe deposit box or trusted family member or friend is the first choice. There are online services which can also encrypt and store this information.
- Leave instructions as to how to handle social media accounts. Transferring this information after death may not be

allowed. All of those license agreements to which we always agree prevent another person from taking over the account. Sites such as Facebook will freeze a page and maintain it as a memorial when it is notified of the death of a user or will deactivate it at the direction of the estate representative.

In today's world, advising family members to contact important advisors, such as attorneys, accountants and financial advisors, is still important, but providing a roadmap as to how to manage the decedent's digital assets is equally vital.

## Ask A Lawyer

I signed a Shareholders Agreement years ago and in that document I agreed to pay my partner a designated amount upon his retirement. He just gave me notice and now I do not want to pay that much because I think the amount is over market value. What can I do?



• This is one of those questions where I have to see your Shareholder's Agreement to give a proper answer. However, based on the information relayed above, it sounds as though you have agreed to a certain price in your agreement. Accepting such language is absolutely not preferable, or standard. A buy-out amount should be determined at the time a shareholder is "departing," whether voluntarily or involuntarily (death or disability). Typically, shareholder agreements provide the amount to be paid to a departing shareholder or their family or estate determined by the regular accountant for the practice and based on the book value of the practice at that time. Parties often agree to a formula the accountant will utilize to determine the proper buyout amount. Should withdrawal be because of death or disability, the amount to be paid may be covered by an insurance policy, if the parties have procured. Here, whether you have an obligation to purchase at the designated price will be governed by the agreement. Your recourse or ability to dispute the buy-out price also will be governed by the agreement. And, similarly, your ability to avoid the buy-out or terminate will be governed by the agreement.

A few general notes on this topic: critical to any potential buy-out language is understanding your potential responsibility should your partner withdraw for any reason. Without a Shareholder's, Operating, or Partnership Agreement, depending on your corporate structure, you will not have a defined obligation, or in the alternative, protection of buy-out language. And finally, the time to address your partnership is when times are good and status quo, not when a partner is looking to leave.

# Three New Requirements for Prescription Drugs In Effect

If you prescribe or dispense medication in New York, you must be aware of three important changes effective on March 30th and August 27, 2013, and March 27, 2015:

#### • Patient English Language Proficiency—Effective March 30, 2013:

As of March 30, 2013, all prescriptions must indicate whether a patient lacks proficiency in English and, if so, the language in which they are proficient. New prescription forms are available at no charge from the NYS Department of Health. Alternately, the prescriber may simply note on the prescription that a patient is not proficient in English and the language of proficiency.

#### • Controlled Substance Registry—Effective August 27, 2013:

As of August 27, 2013, all doctors prescribing or dispensing a schedule II, III, or IV controlled substance in any quantity must query a new controlled drug registry. To access the registry, you must establish an online Health Commerce System (HCS) account. All doctors who directly dispense any controlled substance in any schedule in any quantity to a patient must input into the registry the information concerning the controlled drug they directly dispensed to that patient.

#### • Mandatory E-Prescribing—Effective March 27, 2015:

Beginning March 27, 2015, all prescriptions, including all controlled substances, must be transmitted electronically, paper prescriptions will no longer be acceptable (there are extremely rare exceptions not generally applicable for most dentists).

New York's I-STOP legislation establishes new requirements for all doctors prescribing a schedule II, III, or IV controlled substance or dispensing any controlled substance in any schedule in any quantity. The NYS Department of Health (DOH) has begun establishing a Prescription Monitoring Program Registry. The registry is designed to curb abuse of prescription-controlled drugs. The registry is scheduled to go into effect on August 27, 2013. In order to prescribe or dispense any Schedule II, III, or IV controlled substance after August 27, 2013, you must be able to access the registry.

Beginning on August 27, doctors must consult the registry before prescribing any Schedule II, III, or IV drug to a patient. The registry will contain a minimum of a six-month patient controlled substance history and a maximum of a five-year history that the prescriber can review. The I-STOP law does allow for a health care professional to designate a person to access and consult the registry on his or her behalf, but the health care professional always remains legally responsible for the result and conduct of that process by the designee.

Pharmacists will input information from all the controlled substance prescriptions they fill. Any

health care provider who actually dispenses any controlled substance on any Schedule to a patient, in any quantity, will also be obligated to input that drug dispensing information into the registry.

Prescribers will access the registry through the Health Commerce System online account that they already use for renewing and issuing official New York State prescription forms. While many dentists now opt to do those renewals via paper, the only way you will be able to access the registry is via the HCS online account system.

If you fail to sign up for the registry, you will lose the ability to prescribe any schedule II, III, or IV controlled substance, as well as the ability to dispense any controlled substance directly to a patient. Your license to practice will also be at risk from the Office of Professional Discipline if you attempt to evade or violate the registry system.

## Making Investments: Stay Clear of the Hype

Do mass media financial articles really help you become a better investor? Some do. But keep one caveat in mind: the media have another agenda besides simply informing the public of important news. They also want to make you watch, listen, or pay money to hear their own recommendations.

Shows on cable stations have to make each day sound new and interesting, which can also lead them—and the people who watch them—to overemphasize short-term developments. In fact, a client of mine who was a consultant to one of these TV shows used to call me with buy and sell orders based on what was being said on the set that day about the stock market. Once she even criticized me for not having an "appreciation" for current market events. Ironically, her constant buying and selling soon damped another kind of appreciation—the growth in her investment portfolio.

I'll grant you that television, radio, newspapers, and magazines have made this generation more financially knowledgeable than any other before it; but that doesn't mean people make wiser investment decisions. Like my

client in television, many decide to buy an investment based solely on what they've heard or read in the media. But with few exceptions, I've found that the most popular stocks—and overhyped mutual funds—underperform their peers over long periods of time.

If you're going to base your decisions on what you hear in the media, at least choose your sources wisely. Some financial journalists do stand out for their honest, unbiased reporting on a variety of general financial planning subjects, but be wary as not all do.

Among the print media, some publications that can help you become a better investor include The Wall Street Journal; and the business section of The New York Times, especially its Sunday business section. Bloomberg Businessweek, Money, and SmartMoney also supply useful information. And Bar-

ron's can give you insight about the economy and the stock market that you may not find anywhere else.

Overall, though, financial information you get from the media too often reflects the latest consensus thinking among investors. That tendency, and the media's need to sell publications or boost TV ratings, means you should take each proclamation with a grain of salt and confirm it with objective data not opinions—from other sources. So after listening to the media, dig deeper for unbiased research.
