Promoting Mentorship Opportunities

I would like to thank QCDS once again for giving me the opportunity to serve as president for 2017. Promoting mentorship opportunities for high school students is an impor- owing. In January, which is also known as National Mentant goal for my tenure as president. It would be great to launch this initiative as a summer program that would allow

students to shadow dentists for six weeks. The program could start after the July 4th holiday and end before Labor Day. This is a chance for a young person to explore dentistry as a possible career. For QCDS, this is an opportunity to showcase our commitment to the borough's youth.

My working title for this project is "QCDS Summer Career Shadowing Program." In order for the effort to come to fruition, I ask that QCDS members express interest to volunteer as mentors and determine their time commitments. Some

participants might allow a student to shadow a few hours a day, once or twice a week. Students can observe and ask questions about the dental profession and QCDS members can convey their knowledge to future dentists.

Most Queens public high schools have a STEM program, which includes health careers. Among them are: Hillcrest High School in Jamaica, Mathematics, Science Research and Technology High School in Cambria Heights and Queens Gateway to Health Sciences Secondary School in Jamaica, just to name a few. Student participation in our program can be limited to juniors and seniors. School guidance coun-

selors can select the candidates.

Even Mayor Bill deBlasio supports the concept of shadtoring Month, deBlasio announced a plan to have 1,110 administrative, managerial and professional-titled city em-

ployees mentor youths during their workday. The mayor's effort will start with 150 employees, according to published reports. A recent AM New York article stated "deBlasio hopes to have 14,000 New Yorkers mentor 400 students by 2022." That is encouraging news.

The need to encourage students of color to enter dentistry is crucial. The American Dental Association reported "minorities comprise only 12 percent of students who enter dental school, while minorities make up 25 percent of the general population." The ADA identified

African-Americans, Hispanics and Native Americans as being "underrepresented in the field." Recent statistics from the ADA indicate "58 percent of the population will be comprised of underrepresented groups by 2050."

QCDS could be at the forefront of getting more students of color involved in the field and at the same time raise awareness for better oral health care. Positive interactions with students, other than the ones in our homes or lives, are vital to building a stronger nation. Please consider joining this effort to make the QCDS Summer Career Shadowing Program a reality.

Membership Numbers Are Growing

Over the last ten years, total number of active, licensed members has remained flat. At the same time, the size of the market has grown. Significantly, the increase in the market size is very diverse. Retiring members are mostly homogenous, while dental students and new dentists are very diverse.

Some good news for the current year is that as of the end of November 2016, we have gained over 1,500 members, our

largest growth in ten years. Despite that, because the market is growing so quickly, this still represents a slight decrease in market share. We are very happy with this shift in membership trends, but we need to remember it represents a single data point. We will work to replicate it next year as part of our efforts to develop a positive and identifiable trend.

Campaign to Promote Dentistry

As we all know, the 2016 House passed a resolution authorizing a campaign to promote utilization of dental

services. We have already implemented this program to drive patients to our members' offices. We will be improving Find-A-Dentist, promoting participation to our members, and seeking ways to drive the public to this tool. This will include targeted advertising, currently under development, and work with state and local societies.

U.S. Election Results and Dentistry

The Trump administration is expected to work on ACA changes, tax changes and reversing existing regulations. At this point it appears that there will be some activity to repeal and replace ACA. We expect some current provisions in ACA (addressing pre-existing conditions and allowing some adult children to be covered under parents' policies) to continue under any new version. Our Washington office is prepared to act regardless of the approach to ACA the Trump administration

chooses to follow. The Washington office is also looking carefully at existing regulations. Some of them may be repealed.

Dental Therapy

At the state level, the therapist issue has arisen in at least 20 states. State Government Affairs has been very active, working with the states on this and our efforts have been effective. We will continue to monitor the issue and, in particular, the program

in existence in Minnesota which appears to be struggling. Our CDHC (Community Dental Health Coordinator) Program is growing

Board Priorities for 2017

This year, the Board identified three priority areas for its own work. We will focus on the following:

- Addressing the feasibility of shifting budget authority from the House to the Board: The House of Delegates will make a final determination.
- Licensure Reform—Licensure Portability is very important to not only new

dentists, but middle age and even retiring dentists. Retiring dentists may wish to retire in a different sate and then choose to practice part time. Initial licensure is another important topic for students.

We have a policy passed by the House of Delegates in 2000, which calls for no live patient examination for initial licensure. New York State was the first state to confirm to this policy by granting licensure with PGY -1, which also helped us in solving access to care issues to some extent.

The study of the ADA business model and potential changes to it: We shall be contracting with an outside consulting firm to study our business model and recommend any changes that can be implemented in order to be current. This will help us decide which services we offer to our clients work, and where the potential opportunities are for new services.






