In balloting at the ADA House of Delegates, Dr. Chad P. Gehani, a practicing endodontist in Jackson Heights, was elected president-elect of the American Dental Association.

Dr. Gehani, who had served as an ADA delegate from 2000-14, is the immediate past trustee of the ADA's 2nd District. Dr. Gehani had served as president of the New York State Dental Association in 2011, president of the Queens County Dental Society in 2003 and the president of the Indian Dental Association in 1985-1987. He is also a trustee of the New York State Dental Foundation and is on the Board of Directors of the Empire Political Action Committee. ### Dr. Craig Tischler Becomes QCDS' Newest President, Pledges Increased Members

Craig L. Tischler has set a busy agenda as he assumes the leadership of the Queens County Dental Society.

He said he plans to focus on younger dentists entering the profession and increasing QCDS membership, among other priorities, during his term as the new president of one of the most diverse dental societies in the nation.

"I want to increase participation and allow newer dentists to find a passion for organized dentistry," he said. "We have to encourage new dentists in the region to want to be part of QCDS and lead by example as we inspire them to become active members."

Dr. Tischler said he would like to see QCDS allocate more energy towards younger dentists. "This is how we can influence the future of dentistry for both dentists and their patients."

He said one idea would be to have a QCDS member visit residency programs to talk about the dental society and speak not only about the importance of becom-

ing a member, but also the personal and professional benefits of becoming involved.

"I would like to allocate more resources to the New Residents Committee, currently headed by Dr. Hermali Ajmera. Our New Residents Night is a fun and successful introduction for the new practicing dentist, but there is so much more behind QCDS membership."

That connection seems to have worked for Dr. Tischler. During the 15 years that he has been a QCDS member he has served on the Board, Peer Review Committee and the Executive Director Search Committee. In 2014, Dr. Tischler became president of the Queens Institute for Continuing Education and this past October he served as an alternate delegate to the American Dental Association convention in Hawaii.

"It was quite an experience to be at the ADA convention and to be present when it was announced that our very own Dr. Chad Gehani became ADA pres-

### **QCDS** Mourns the Passing of State Senator Jose R. Peralta

The Queens County Dental Society mourns the sudden and devastating passing of a great friend, Senator Jose Peralta. He was a friend of organized dentistry and a guardian of the public who brought hope to hundreds of thousands of residents of the County of Queens. To the Senator, Queens was always Queens.

He grew up in a very dentally conscientious family. In fact, his godmother, former QCDS President Dr. Mercedes Mota Martinez, is still a practicing dentist in his family." Queens and has served on the QCDS Board of Trustees for more than 30 years. Senator Peralta was so endeared by the residents of his district that they graciously elected him as the first New York State Senator of Dominican descent.

November 10, 1971, in New York City to parents who had emigrated from the Dominican Republic. He attended public schools in Queens and graduated from Queens College, where he studied psychology and sociology and

served as student body president.

Senator Peralta was invited and graciously accepted numerous invitations to attend the OCDS officers' installation banquet year after year. Not only did he speak directly to the membership at these events, but also recognized leaders by providing multiple citations to them boosting their morals and encouraging younger leaders to step up to the plate and serve their community and organized dentistry. Besides being a friend of organized dentistry, Senator Peralta championed the Dream Act. He worked on making schools in Queens safer by advocating for extended speed camera times and much, much more.

His colleagues took to Twitter. Gov. Andrew M. Cuomo called him "a dedicated public servant" and a "relentless advocate" for

Adriano D. Espaillat, who was the first Dominican-American elected to Congress, called Mr. Peralta a "loving husband and brother who adored and protected

And Mayor Bill de Blasio wrote on Twitter: "Jose Peralta was a proud son of Queens and the Dominican Republic. He worked his way up from the grass roots, with heart and tenacity."

The Honorable Senator Peralta José Rafael Peralta was born on was one of the most gracious, kind, compassionate, and family oriented men-and above all a humanitarian like no other.

Without a doubt, the highlight of 2018 for the New York State Dental Association was the election in October of our very own Chad Gehani to the office of ADA president elect. Many of you were very much involved in Chad's campaign, and on behalf of the NYSDA Board, I wish to heartily thank you for your support. complishment. office of ADA president-elect. Membership recruitment and retention continues to be a matter of huge consequence and opportunity—for the organization. This year, the ADA began a pilot program with NYSDA to waive its \$30 dues for postgraduate members. As a result, NYSDA transferred 1,059 graduate student/resident members into NYSDA and into their respective components at the end of September. According to NYSDA and ADA Bylaws, graduate students/residents are not active members. Therefore, they do not count toward representation, but are eligible to receive all other member benefits. These graduate students/residents can elect to become active members of the tripartite, but they must first call the Association to change their category and then they will begin paying dues in their appropriate category. It is now up to us to welcome these new resident members and mentor them and make them feel welcome.

Earlier this year, NYSDA began a pilot project that has started to allow for membership approval and invoicing to take place immediately, rather than the current timeconsuming process. The delay has been problematic and could account for the gap between candidates who apply

for membership and those who actually follow through and become members.

These are just two ways in which NYSDA is seeking to enhance overall membership value.

### **NYSDA** and Legislation

In the legal/legislative arena, NYSDA is actively monitoring multiple investigations, including one by the New York State attorney general that is underway into DIY orthodontics. Elsewhere, we are seeking a new sponsor for the bill to amend the defielection...of our very own nition of dentistry to allow for dentists to do many of the cosmetic procedures that they are now trained to do, as for-

> mer sponsor Assemblyman Joseph Morelle is now serving as Congressman for the 25th congressional district.

Upcoming NYSDA annual sessions will be in Buffalo (2019), Binghamton (2020) and New Jersey (2021). I look forward to seeing those of you who can take the time to attend these sessions, which are not only informative in terms of gover-

### **Paid Family Leave Changes for 2019**

Of those, 42 had no visible dental problems. 13 had Centers in Jackson Heights and Astoria on November 7th mild dental problems, five had severe dental problems, and 8th respectively. This was the

first time in recent history that QCDS members worked with a mostly special needs children population.

The Queens County Dental Society partnered with Colgate for both of these events. Colgate provided the Bright Smiles, Bright Futures Colgate van on which the children were screened.

"It is important for the develop-




