New QCDS President Dr. Chiran Reddy To Focus on Overseas Missions, Membership

Incoming Queens County Dental Society President Dr. Chiran K. Reddy will bring an emphasis on community service, outreach and global humanitarian engagement with him when he assumes office next month.

For decades, Dr. Reddy has balanced his Floral Park general dentistry practice with humanitarian missions around the world. He hopes to bring that same spirit of service to the local dental community. Dr. Reddy's humanitarian work began 25 years ago when he served as the only dentist on a Guyana Watch medical mission. He returned to Guyana the following year with a mobile dental unit containing dental chairs to conduct clinics in remote parts of the country. Over time, he expanded the mission by inviting other dentists to participate. His next mission is scheduled for this summer and will include 20-25 medical and dental professionals. A future mission with Drs. Savitha Reddy and Rekka Gehani is now also being planned.

Locally, Dr. Reddy has collaborated with fellow healthcare professionals through the faith-based Dental Outreach Program, a ministry of St. Raphael and St. Thomas Moore Church. The group leads annual community dental outreach programs providing free oral health screenings, hygiene instruction and preventive care to underserved families in the community. It also collaborates with local dental professionals and church ministries to organize oral health education workshops for children, seniors and immigrant families, and mentor's students interested in healthcare careers.

Dr. Reddy has also volunteered as a dentist at camps in India, where he

organized and led mobile dental units to rural areas through the Indian Dental Association.

Currently serving as president-elect of QCDS, Dr. Reddy has been deeply involved in the organization for many years, including having served on the Board of Trustees. He will succeed his wife, Dr. Savitha Reddy, as president, making them what is believed to be the first husband and wife team to hold the office consecutively. Plans are being made for a formal installation ceremony.

Drs. Chiran and Savitha Reddy practice together and are part of a family with strong ties to the healthcare profession. Their daughter, Nena, is a veterinary doctor, and their son, Sunil, is doing a pediatric dentistry residency.

Dr. Reddy is one of eight siblings; six of them are physicians practicing in the United States. His interest in dentistry was inspired by his father, a professor and head of a department of surgery at a hospital in India.

Dr. Reddy earned his DDS degree from the New York University College of Dentistry in 1991, after receiving his Bachelor of Dental Surgery degree from Raja Mutai Dental College and Hospital at Annamalai University, India, in

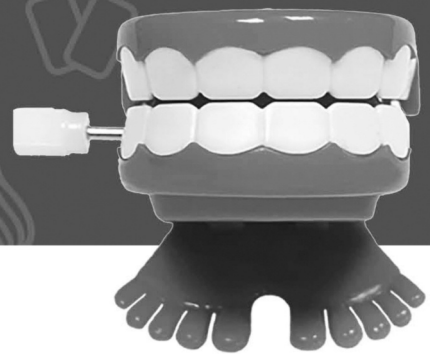

Good, Bad and Ugly: A Market Briefing

Editor's Note: The following article is part of a QCDS Bulletin installment series on retirement planning by financial advisor Peter Klein, a principal of Aline Wealth.

The theme of this article is inspired by the classic Clint Eastwood film “The Good, The Bad and The Ugly,” a fitting metaphor for the complex dynamics shaping today’s markets. Let’s explore what we’re seeing—and how we’re positioning to help our clients stay on track through the winding road of investing.

The Good

- **Earnings Resilience**
Corporate earnings have been solid, with year-over-year growth nearing seven percent, largely driven by the tech sector. This is a positive signal amid broader economic uncertainty.
- **Political Engagement**
We’re seeing a more active and assertive administration. While the long-term effects are uncertain, engagement is generally preferable to inertia.
- **Peace Dividend Potential**
If geopolitical tensions ease, the resulting peace dividend could be a meaningful tailwind for global markets.
- **AI Infrastructure: The Picks and Axes Play**
While AI is the headline, the real opportunities may lie in the second and third-order effects of this technological revolution. **Cybersecurity** – Protecting the massive data centers being built. **Copper** – Essential for wiring and connectivity. **HVAC and Fire Protection** – Data centers require robust cooling and safety systems. **Energy** – These facilities are energy-intensive, making power sourcing and efficiency critical. We’re asking: “Who’s supplying the picks and axes in this gold rush?” That’s where we see potential.
- **Emerging Markets & Value**
Emerging market stocks have lagged for years, but we believe they’re poised for a turnaround. Valuations are compelling, and many companies are fundamentally strong, but underappreciated. This is a classic value opportunity—with a built-in margin of safety.



The Bad

- **Debt and Deficits**
The U.S. national debt has surged to \$39 trillion, with deficits projected in the six to seven percent range. This is unsustainable and deeply concerning.

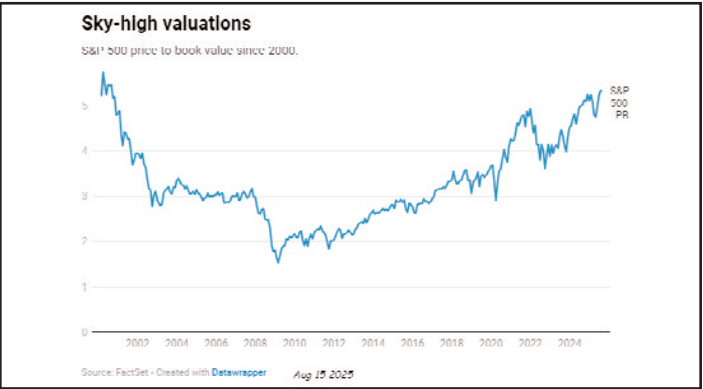
- **Interest Rates**
While a minor Fed rate cut is possible, we don’t foresee significant easing. A sharp drop would likely signal economic distress—something we’re not currently anticipating.
- **Market Concentration**
The top 10 stocks now represent over 40 percent of the S&P 500’s market cap. This level of concentration historically signals caution.
- **Valuation Discipline**
Price matters. While excitement can drive markets in the short term, long-term compounding requires discipline. Avoiding overvalued assets is key to protecting client wealth.

The Ugly

- **Speculative Froth**
Meme stocks, crypto hype, AI mania, and IPO exuberance are heating up. We’ve seen this before. It rarely ends well.
- **AI Spending Without Returns**
Hundreds of billions are being poured into AI and data centers. But what’s the ROI? We’re not yet seeing the productivity gains to justify the spending. That’s a red flag.
- **Energy & Infrastructure Strain**
Data centers consume massive amounts of energy. We’re analyzing where they’re being built, what energy sources are available and how to invest accordingly. This is a critical, often overlooked, part of the AI story.
- **Stagflation Risk**
We may be entering a light stagflationary environment—sluggish growth paired with sticky inflation. This puts the Fed in a bind: stimulate the economy or fight inflation? Either way, it’s a tough spot.
- **Inflation Pressures**
Tariffs are rising, and someone has to pay—likely the consumer. This contributes to persistent inflation, which is bad news for equity investors.

Valuation Matters More Than Ever

We’re seeing stretched valuations, especially in the S&P 500 and the so-called “Magnificent Seven.” Net income growth for these companies is slowing, yet their multiples remain sky-high. That’s a disconnect.

Meeting Dental Licensure Requirements

Requirements to be a New York State certified dentist are many. To make sure all are familiar with mandated requirements, here are some important licensure regulations.

Dentists holding a New York State license are required to fulfill the following continuing education requirements under New York State Law:

- 60 continuing education credit hours every three-year registration period, of which 18 can be home study and 42 must be "Live/ Interactive".
- New York State mandated Ethics and Jurisprudence course (once in your lifetime).
- New York State mandated Tobacco Cessation/Oral Cancer course (once in a lifetime).
- New York State mandated Child Abuse Course (new rule/course as above, update!).
- New York State mandated Infection Control course (once every four years).
- New York State mandated Opioid Prescribing Course (Once each license cycle)
- CPR course: you must maintain a current certification (varies

1-3 years). CPR must be taken in person.

- All New York State Employers are required to have Sexual Harassment Training
- The New York State Department of Education does not accept Practice Management courses and they cannot count toward the 60 credits needed for licensing renewal

Updated and New Child Abuse / Mandated Reporter Training

All participants should note that they are attending a continuing education (CE) course. The NYSDA CE registry is no longer accepted by the New York State Department of Education.

As part of NYSDA’s ADA CERP provider program, here’s what you need to know to document your CE credits: After the Course

- Certificate of Completion: You’ll receive a certificate from QCDS confirming your attendance.
- Keep Your Certificate (You, the licensee, are responsible for maintaining your proof of CE). NYSED recommends that you retain CE

certificates for at least six years for audits or credentialing purposes.

- Optional: Use CE Navigator-NYSDA's CE Navigator helps you track of CE and generate transcripts for your three-year registration period.

You are not required to use CE Navigator, nor is it connected to the New York State Education Department.

- Log in or create an account (scan the QR code)
- Enter course details from your CE Certificate
- Upload your certificate (if desired)
- Stay on top of CE requirements and set important reminders

Remove the entire pathologic periodontal ligament and flush socket twice. Use #6 carbide bur, make holes through the Lamina Dura to trabecular bone and establish Regional Acceleratory Phenomenon.

Insert Large or Slim sized OsteoGen® Bone Grafting Plugs and allow blood to absorb.

Two Slim OsteoGen® Plugs are in place. Suture over top of socket to contain Plug. Do not suture through Plug. No membrane is required.

OsteoGen® is a low density bone graft and the OsteoGen® Plugs will show radiolucent on the day of placement.

As the OsteoGen® crystals are resorbed and replaced by host bone, the site will become radiopaque.

The collagen promotes keratinized soft tissue coverage while the OsteoGen® crystals resorb to form solid bone. In this image, a core sample was retrieved.

Implant is placed. Note the histology showing mature osteocytes in lamellar bone formation. Some of the larger OsteoGen® crystals and clusters are slowly resorbing. Bioactivity is demonstrated by the high bone to crystal contact, absent of any fibrous tissue encapsulation.
